WELCOME STADIUM EVENT COVID PROTOCOLS

Event Protocols:

1. All individuals entering the facility need to conduct a symptom check.
 - The symptom check process will be performed by staff upon entering the facility. Any positive symptoms would follow the procedures previously established.
 - If they are at the event, the administrator will follow established procedures to remove the individual from the facility and report the event so that Dayton Public Schools and ODH policies are followed.
2. Each common area, pressbox, score table and ticketing area should be furnished with hand sanitizer.
3. Team areas/benches should be disinfected prior to each use.
4. Towels will not be provided. Each athlete should have their own if they require one.
5. Team personnel will be limited to participating athletes, coaches, medical/training staff and gameday staff.
6. Media will be in designated zones away from team areas.

Suspected and Confirmed Cases:

1. Any individual who is either suspected to have come into contact with someone or they themselves have been confirmed, will not be permitted into the facility.

Spectators:

1. Event capacity will be 15% or capacity not to exceed 1500 spectators outdoors.
2. Spectators will enter the facility at the Home Entrance to Welcome Stadium.
3. Spectators will sit only on one side of the facility, allowing room for overflow of team areas.

4. Spectators must clear the symptom check process prior to attending events. Spectators should stay at home if they are not feeling well and/or exhibiting symptoms.
5. Spectators are required to wear face coverings while attending all events.
6. Spectators are restricted from competition areas and from visiting with student athletes and event personnel before or after events.
7. There can be no congregating in aisle ways, gate entrances, parking lots and common areas before, during and after games.
8. Spectators must practice social distancing with members outside of their direct family parties.
9. Spectators are asked to leave immediately after the game has ended.
10. Seats will be designated in groups of 4 with 6 feet of distance between groups and will be staggered in every other row.
11. Spectators must only sit in marked seating areas to promote social distancing.
12. Spectators not sitting in assigned areas will be asked to move or will be asked to leave the stadium.
13. Aisle ways will be marked with directional arrows for the safe flow of spectators.
14. No student sections will be permitted. Students will be required to sit with family members in designated seating areas.
15. One-way entrances and exits will be marked.
16. Signage will be posted for social distancing, facemask requirements, and paths of travel.

Team Placement

1. Teams will enter at the Visitors Entrance of Welcome Stadium
2. After completing the symptom check, teams will follow signage to approved team areas.
3. Teams must maintain social distancing with other Teams in the designated team areas.
4. Teams must NOT congregate in exit/entryways.
5. Teams should not fraternize with other teams, and team personnel should be present to monitor student-athletes.
6. Teams should prepare to be placed outside in the event there is not adequate space in the designated covered areas.
7. There will be designated areas for warm-ups.
8. If tents are used, they must be set-up at the upper level of the bleachers, not to impede the visibility of other Teams.

Field Event Rules

1. Each jumper/vaulter will have 5 minutes to complete their attempts before moving on to the next height. (Timing rules still apply).
2. When the jumper/vaulter has completed their turn the mats will be sanitized.
3. Athletes should utilize their OWN implements.
4. Sanitation will be available to clean between implement use.

PPE Use:

1. Athletes must wear masks when they arrive at the event and when leaving the event. They should wear masks in locker rooms, training rooms and common areas when not actually physically active, eating or drinking. They should also be worn in team areas when not actively engaged in play.
2. Coaches and game day personnel should wear masks at all times.
3. Officials should wear masks as long as this will not directly impede the effective completion of their duties and responsibilities.

Athletic Training Rooms:

1. Face masks are required at all times by everyone in the training rooms.
2. Athletic training room maximum occupancy will be posted and must be followed at all times.
3. Taping and treatment tables should be disinfected between each athlete regardless of the physical barrier used.
4. Tables must be placed 6 feet apart.
5. Use outdoor areas to treat or tape when possible.
6. Common surfaces should be disinfected regularly during use and prior and after practices, games and events.
7. Efforts should be made to utilize premade ice bags that can be picked up, limiting the number of individuals using the ice machines and scoops.
8. If possible COVID-19 cases are being evaluated in the training room, access by others must be limited during the evaluation.

Cleaning and Sanitation:

1. Time must be allotted between practice sessions and games to allow teams to exit prior to new teams arriving and for proper sanitizing to take place. This will be done by the development of practice schedules and communicating those schedules with the custodial staff for proper cleaning.
 - Restrooms and high touch areas will be sanitized at least twice during the event in between team levels.
2. Locker rooms, weight rooms, restrooms, and athletic training rooms must be cleaned and sanitized frequently. A cleaning schedule will be followed on a daily basis to achieve this.
3. Signage promoting hand washing, mask wearing, social distancing and respiratory etiquette will be prominently displayed throughout the facilities.
4. A complete cleaning and sanitizing schedule will be developed to include:
 - Frequent cleaning of high touch areas.
 - Allowing adequate time between events for cleaning.
 - Following protocols for cleaning and disinfecting COVID-19 cases if a positive case is identified at the event.
 - Making hand sanitizer available at all events.

Locker Rooms: WILL NOT BE PERMITTED FOR USE DURING THE OUTDOOR SEASON

Concessions:

1. Outside food is not permitted in the stadium.
2. Water will be permitted inside of the stadium.

Parking Lot Events:

Events held in the Welcome Stadium Parking lot must adhere to the same protocols as events held inside of Welcome Stadium. (Please see Event Protocols above)

1. Designated areas for participants, spectators, and event staff must be clearly marked off.
